Topic: Global Citizenship: Towards a New World Order

Led by: Jay M. Winter, Professor of History, Yale University, New Haven, USA

Most of us think of global capitalism as the ruling paradigm. In Professor Winter's view, however, the next paradigm is global citizenship.

What does the concept of trans-national citizenship imply, and what are the consequences for politics and hence economics? Jay Winter, Charles J. Stille Professor of History at Yale University, will present his insights into this highly controversial topic and particularly focus on social and political movements, environmental and women's rights as well as human rights.

Jay Winter is a specialist on conflicts and cultural clashes and their impacts on the 20th and 21st century. He is the author or co-author of a dozen books, including *Socialism and the Challenge of War*, *Ideas and Politics in Britain, 1912-18*, *The Great War and the British People*, *The Fear of Population Decline*, *The Experience of World War I*, *Sites of Memory*, *Sites of Mourning: The Great War In European Cultural History, 1914-1918: The Great War and the Shaping of the 20th Century* and his most recent, *The Generation of Memory*. He has edited or co-edited 13 books and contributed more than 40 book chapters to edited volumes. The historian was co-producer, co-writer and chief historian for the USA's Public Broadcasting Service series "The Great War and the Shaping of the 20th Century," which won an Emmy Award in 1997.

Winter taught at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, the University of Warwick and the University of Cambridge before joining the faculty of Columbia University in 2000 and then the Yale faculty one year later.
